School Nurse COVID-19 Protocols for 2021-2022

- <u>Health Office Visits</u>: When a student presents to the health office with symptoms of COVID, the student will be asked to wear a surgical mask (if a student is wearing a cloth mask we will provide them a surgical mask) to aid in the prevention of further transmission of illness.
- <u>Absence</u>: Students will be asked to stay home when ill and students will be encouraged to have COVID 19 testing.
 - o Students will be provided COVID-19 testing information
 - Students declining testing will be excluded from school for 10 days based upon DHHS recommendations
- <u>Positive COVID 19</u>: If a student or household member tests positive for please notify the school nurse and follow the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services. (NHDHHS) quarantine guidance.
- Quarantine: The following information relates to quarantine:
 - o Community/School Setting:

NHDHHS will not quarantine classrooms and is not requiring quarantine of individuals exposed to COVID-19 in the community when there is no evidence of an outbreak.
