



Principal's Message:

Welcome to the September School Newsletter. For those who are new to Simonds, I will send a newsletter each month. In the newsletter, I highlight important events happening at Simonds. You will also be able to read updates from the school nurse, counselor, Boys and Girls Club and other groups around the school. Hopefully you will find this a helpful tool to learn more about what is happening at Simonds.

As we start our third week of school (and our first full week), students and teachers appear to have gotten into the swing of school routines. The past two weeks students in 5th and 2nd grade have been reviewing **school rules** over the loudspeaker each morning. They are reminding students what it means to be safe, responsible and respectful at school. Additionally, students are also beginning the process of AIMSweb testing and other assessments to measure students' current achievement levels. This will help us differentiate instruction and make informed decisions about student placement during our What I Need (WIN) blocks.

Last week Simonds staff visited the Warner Historical Society's exhibit "**250 Years of School in Warner.**" It was a really fun chance for us to see how our profession has changed over the years. There were examples of early blackboards, a homemade intercom system and yearbooks from one hundred years ago. For me, this exhibit was a great reminder that schools have changed dramatically over the years and the teachers of the past dealt with a much more limited set of issues than our modern times. Public education has become a much more complex endeavor involving not just the teaching of mathematics and reading. Teachers are more responsible than ever for addressing the individual needs of every student, both academically through targeted instruction and assessment data as well as social-emotionally through our Caring Schools Curriculum and school competencies. While the methods have changed dramatically, the goal remains the same - to develop citizens capable of contributing in meaningful ways to society.

In the Kearsarge School District, we work towards this goal through our mission and vision statements and our district goals. Our district vision is *inspiring learners, committing to community, contributing to a dynamic world*. Each year Simonds staff develop our own building goals linked to this vision and the school board's strategic plan. This year our focus remains on **Competency Based Education**. Over the past few years, teachers have developed grade-level competencies for each subject. These competencies are the 'guide' for our curriculum and instruction. This year we will be working on developing assessments that measure student mastery of these competencies. While some of these measures will be 'traditional' paper and pencil tests, the emphasis will shift towards real-world application of skills. I am looking forward to how this process changes our instruction and assessment practices.

NOTES FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE: Reminder: All kindergarten and new students to Simonds are required to submit a copy of a physical exam (dated within 1 year) and immunizations prior to the start of school. If you have not submitted this paperwork yet, please do so as soon as possible

Please continue to screen your children for symptoms of COVID-19. Keep your child home and contact the school nurse if they have any symptoms. We are also starting to see seasonal allergies and colds throughout the school. Students still need to show proof of a negative COVID test if experiencing any new or unexplained COVID symptoms (**fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting or diarrhea**). It also covers energy efficiency funding programs offered by NH utilities and rebates on new technologies and products such as electric and gas appliances and high efficiency electric heating/cooling equipment.
