## Principal's Message:

I hope everyone is looking forward to April vacation. At the Stokes house, we are definitely looking forward to some very needed rest and some visits with family that we haven't seen in awhile. When we return from break, there will be about 35 days of school left before summer break. While it is exciting to think about summer days, there are a lot of 'things' left to do in the school year before summer vacation can happen at Simonds.

Field trips will be starting soon. As a reminder, you cannot chaperone field trips if you have not been **fingerprinted**. The turn-around time for these has been about 8-10 weeks. You should schedule a time with Mrs. Grimes ASAP if you are interested in chaperoning. Even then, I cannot promise that you will be approved by the time of your child's field trip.

When students return after April vacation, we will be beginning some of our spring assessments. Most importantly, 3rd, 4th and 5th graders will take the **Statewide Assessment (SAS)** starting during the week of May 28th. Please do your best to ensure that your child is in school for those testing days. Students completed the writing portion of the SAS test in March, which means that students still need to complete the Reading and Mathematics assessment. Our fifth-grade students will also be assessed in Science. The purpose of these assessments is to measure our students' mastery of skills in comparison to grade-level standards. As this is a computerized assessment, students will test using Chromebooks. Test sessions will last roughly an hour and a half each day. You will probably receive more specific information from your child's classroom teacher later in the month. All Simonds students will also complete their **AIMSwebPlus** spring benchmark. There will be more to come on both of these assessments when we return in May.

Before we head on break, we have a lot of exciting events happening here. Thanks to the PTO and MainStreet Warner, Inc., we will be hosting Cynthia Lord, the author of *Because of the Rabbit*, this Thursday. Classes have been listening to the book and decorating their doors in preparation of her visit. Students have also been working in small groups called Simonds Squads on other activities focused on the book, including painting inspirational messages on rocks and playing a game called Two Truths and a Lie. As a culminating event for the Read-a-Thon, we will host <u>Wildlife Encounters</u> on Wednesday. They will bring animals for us to see and winners of the Read-a-Thon will be announced at this assembly.
