### Principal's Message:

I hope everyone is having an enjoyable holiday season! At the Stokes house, things are a bit hectic right now as we try to juggle sports schedules, homework, holiday shopping, and visiting with family. I am looking forward to a chance to perhaps relax before the busy time of the new year and the return of my oldest son's return home for college break.

Things are also very busy here at Simonds. We are preparing for the **Holiday Celebration** (see page 2 for more details) which will be held the day before the holiday break. Thanks to Ms. Bragg, students and teachers also decorated a tree at the town hall for the Festival of Trees. With the help of Mrs. James, students also participated in the first-ever Kearsarge Spelling League. Students in grades 2-5 spelled various challenge words and then awards were given throughout the district for achievement. At the end of the year, our highest performers will compete with other elementary students across the district. In my opinion, this is a much more inclusive program than our traditional spelling bee.

Earlier in the month, staff shared the rough draft of the district's **Portrait of a Learner** with students. The Portrait of a Learner will be a "guide" for all staff and students in Kearsarge to help model the key characteristics of every learner/student in our district. Currently, the draft focuses on 3 key attributes caring, curios and conscientious. The Portrait of a Learner committee will use student and staff feedback to re-draft the current document. In the near future, I would anticipate the committee asking for parent and community feedback as well. Similarly, the district is also working on developing the **Portrait of an Educator**. Again, this guide will outline the key characteristics of all Kearsarge educators (instead of students) and be the guide for how we define educator effectiveness in the district. We are lucky to have Simonds' representation on each of these committees.

I also met with several Unified Arts representatives across the district this past week as part of our **Kearsarge Arts Committee**. This group is responsible for planning Artist in Residence programs at each of the elementary schools. Mr. Mitchell and Ms. Dubreuil are in the process of organizing a visit in early spring at Simonds by Marek Bennett. He is a local graphic artist who specializes in historical fiction.
